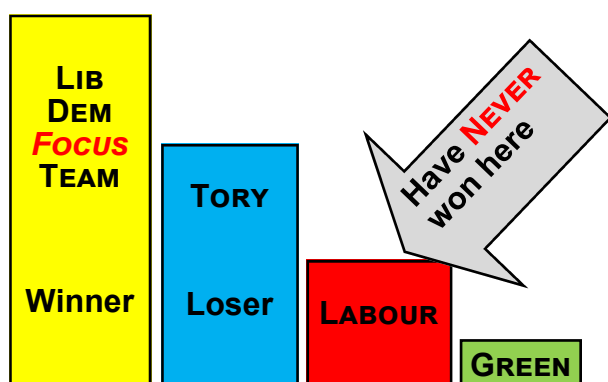

BETTER ROAD SAFETY

LESS LITTER



We're not against MK East - 60% of the houses to be built are needed for the children of families already here. But we're challenging the road traffic assumptions along the V11 which affect Willen.

This is the final link of Fen Street which, when completed this summer, will run from Northfield to the A421. Uroy has confirmed there will be a signalised junction here. Meanwhile Sam & Kerrie have achieved a **£1 million** grant over 3 years to be spent on road safety improvements throughout our area.



The litter-picking network Uroy established now has 67 members across our area.



UROY has lived and worked in Milton Keynes for most of his life, based in Broughton Gate. He is a university lecturer and also runs a college helping less fortunate people to gain qualifications. He has been a councillor before and is also a former President of the MK Equality Council. He strongly believes that every individual should have access to the same chances in life. He has a particular interest in homelessness & mental health, real life problems too often swept under the carpet.

You'll have two votes this election. Your **Yellow** ballot paper is for the Milton Keynes Council elections, Your **White** ballot paper is for the Thames Valley Police & Crime Commissioner. You do **NOT** have to vote the same way for both.

John Howson is our candidate for Police & Crime Commissioner. He is strongly committed to local policing. He is an active supporter of Neighbourhood Watches (we've helped set up eight in our area) and of fixed cameras to deter speeding.

We've explained to him a local resident's idea for a voluntary register held by the Police of all the CCTV & ring bell units in our area. This would save the Police having to go from door to door after a crime has been committed asking who has got a CCTV unit. They'd be able to go straight to the relevant house(s). John will take this up with the Chief Constable.
