### **HERE'S WHAT WE'D DO**

### **NATIONALLY, WE WOULD:**

- Reduce the standard rate of VAT from 20% to 17.5% for a year.
- Introduce a windfall tax on oil & gas profits.
- Use this to double the Warm Home Discount & extend it to everyone on Pension & Universal Credit.
- Double the Winter Fuel Allowance.
- Roll out an emergency home & business insulation programme.
- Re-instate & make permanent the £1,000 Universal Credit boost.
- Raise benefits by the true rate of inflation (now 7%) rather than by 3.1 %

### **LOCALLY, WE HAVE ALREADY:**

- Set aside over £15 million to help residents on low incomes pay their council tax bill.
- Provided £3 million for concessionary public transport fares and £500,000 to help with insulation & heating costs for those worst off.
- Supported the MK Foodbank Xtra, community food larders & a Local Welfare Provision Scheme to help residents in need with essential furniture & kitchen equipment.
- Offered grants for childcare deposits & after school support.

We will also provide a council tax discount to many residents who are currently ineligible for the Government's council tax rebate scheme.

...came to Milton Keynes to work at the Open University. He has also worked in France, America, Pakistan & Hong Kong. For 10 years he has run the annual Cornerstone Christmas Appeal, collecting over £120,000 for local charities.

He has been a councillor in this area for over 20 years and was Mayor of Milton Keynes 2019 - 20. He has twice been Leader of the Council. He has been a magistrate, a member of the Milton Keynes Health Authority, the Thames Valley Police Authority and a trustee of the Bletchley Park Trust and the Parks Trust. He was the first chair of the city's Community Relations Council.

He has been a school governor of a number of schools, as well as a member of the national General Teaching Council (the professional body for teachers) until its abolition in 2012.
