Social Care

Proper reform of social care is one of the biggest challenges facing our country. It cannot wait any longer.

Our plan would:

- Ensure no one has to sell their home to pay for care by introducing free personal care. based on the model introduced by the Scottish Liberal Democrat-Labour government in 2002.
- Introduce a more generous means test and assistance for those unable to pay for their accommodation costs.
- Move towards a preventative approach to social care, so people can stay in their own homes for longer.
- Introduce a real living wage for care workers and invest skills. professionalisation and accreditation of the workforce.



Roll on the bins...

By now you should have received notification from the council as to whether you'll have the new wheelie bins or sack collection. Bins will have started being delivered from 5th June. They'll arrived taped up with a reminder not to start using them before the 28th August (for first collection w.c 4th September). The black bin will have a leaflet taped to the lid which tells you what to put in each bin. There will also be a handy calendar which shows which recycling bin to put out each week. If you've submitted a review as to whether you're getting bins or sacks, these won't be completed until the end of June so you may have the bins/sacks delivered before the final decision has been reached. Any items that won't be needed will be collected by the council before the new service begins.

Willen & Willen Park MK East Latest

Berkeley St James will be re-starting work on the MK East project shortly and met the Willen Residents Liaison Group earlier this month. Because of increasing construction costs the project has been re-phased. Phase 1 - involving the closure of the A509 for around 18 months - will start in August and continue into 2025. This will be carried out in two halves - first, from the Tickford roundabout going south to the Holiday Inn: and then from the junction with the road to Cranfield. to go north to the Holiday Inn. No decision has been taken yet on the timing of Phases 2 and 3. It is "very unlikely" that the trees bordering Tongwell Street on the Carleton Gate side of the estate will be removed before January next year.
